



LETTHERE BE LIGHT

DC's latest luxury condo project is a study in luminous living.

World-renowned architect Enrique Norten has put his stamp on many cities around the world with his modern glass-and-steel designs, including the Rutgers Business School, the Miami Design District, the Mercedes House in New York City and the New York Public Library. This spring, Norten delivers on another one of his signature structures with Westlight condos in DC's West End neighborhood. The luxury space features a multitiered, cantilevered glass facade that allows all 71 units to have floor-to-ceiling windows on three sides of living space.

This high-end iteration includes everything residents have come to expect from the developer, EastBanc, including custom Italian cabinetry, Waterworks fixtures in the bathrooms, and Bosch and Thermador appliances in the kitchen. Westlight has a 24-hour concierge, a porter and the city's largest rooftop lap pool at 25 meters. The sales center is now open by appointment only (the impressive virtual reality tour of the building with Oculus glasses is worth the appointment alone). "This is one of the most [architecturally] complicated residential buildings in the city," says EastBanc CEO Anthony Lanier.
